Introduction

What is Animal Welfare?

Animal welfare means how an animal is coping with the conditions in which it lives. An animal is in a good state of welfare if it is healthy, comfortable, well-nourished, safe, able to express innate behavior, and if it is not suffering from unpleasant states such as pain, fear, and distress.

Good animal welfare addresses all the following factors in order to promote positive experiences and mental states:

- Nutrition
- Environment
- Health
- Behavior
- Mental

The Five Freedoms

This core concept states that all animals deserve:

- Freedom from hunger or thirst
- Freedom from discomfort
- Freedom from pain, injury or disease
- Freedom to express normal behaviors
- Freedom from fear and distress

How can we provide good welfare to orphan elephants?



Freedom from hunger and thirst

Inputs: Access to fresh water and a nutritional diet

Outcomes: Healthy and growing; good body condition,

Freedom from discomfort

Inputs: Appropriate shelter, comfortable resting areas, access to natural habitat and substrates

Outcomes: Healthy skin and feet; no signs of stress

Freedom from pain, injury, diseases

Inputs: Good veterinary care, safe environment, clean enclosure

Outcomes: No illness or wounds; alert, playful, and healthy

Freedom to express normal behaviors

Inputs: Sufficient space, opportunities to socialize, natural habitat

Outcomes: Active, alert, and content; explores environment; playful

Freedom from fear and distress

Inputs: Quiet and safe environment, kind caregivers, positive reinforcement training if appropriate

Outcomes: Outgoing and inquisitive; happy and content
